Blooming of the Cross

This Easter Sunday, The Waterbury
Baptist Ministries and First
Congregational Church congregations
will incorporate a folk ceremony called
"the flowering of the Cross". Members
of both churches are encouraged to

bring fresh cut flowers and greenery to decorate a cross that has been raided in the church front yard. The flowering of the cross represents the transition from Good Friday to Easter, from meditation on Jesus' death to joyful celebration of his resurrection. The ceremony transforms a barren cross, a reminder of Jesus' death, into an Easter symbol, covered with fresh, living flowers. The cross serves not only as a emblem of Jesus' resurrection, but as a sign of hope for our community.

Instructions:

All are encouraged to bring flowers between 9:00 am – 12:00 pm. Holy Saturday (April 8th). Encourage other in our community to bring flowers. Someone will be there if you need assistance. Later in the day, drive by to see the cross that symbolized the new life, hope, and beauty which Easter brings. Many of your families may want to get your picture made in front of the cross, Easter morning.
