THE IMAGE REPRESENTS ROCKWELL's vision of ' FREEDOM FROM WANT', part of his famous DEPRESSION-ERA SERIES FOR THE SATURDAY EVENING POST KNOWN AS THE FOUR FREEDOMS.

IN ROCKWELL"S RENDERING , THE FAMILY APPEARS TO BE ON THE VERGE OF RECITING A BLESSING. THE SCENE SEEMS TO SPRING OUT OF LONG-AGO PAST. WITH AFTER-SCHOOL SPORTS EVENING MEETINGS, AND BOTH PARENTS WORKING LONG HOURS, FEW FAMILIES ARE ABLE TO SIT DOWN TO DINNER AT THE SAME TIME, LET ALONE OFFER A BLESSING TOGETHER.

THE SIMPLE ACT OF GIVING AND RECEIVING BLESSING IS BECOMING A LOST ART. IT'S UP TO US CHRISTIANS TO FIND THE COURAGE TO RESET THE EXAMPLE IN DAY TO DAY LIFE EXPERIENCES.
